A crowd of nearly 160 gathered at the Capitol Plaza Hotel Oct. 12 to honor Daniel M. Lambert with the 2006 Bal Jeffrey Award. Dr. Lambert, recently retired president of Baker University, was credited with a key leadership role in developing the relationship between Stormont-Vail HealthCare and Baker University. This relationship led to the formation of the Baker School of Nursing on the Stormont-Vail Campus.
