

As we strive to address the foundational elements of health, we have focused on food security, health equity, education and economic vitality. TAKING ON CHALLENGES

As a health care organization, we're used to challenges. Patients turn to us with all types of ailments. We pride ourselves in always being ready no matter what the challenge may be. So, when we began hearing rumors of a potentially deadly virus spreading on the other side of the world, we went straight to work preparing to support our patients and community.

We developed an Incident Command structure to oversee policies, procedures and operations to address the special circumstances of COVID-19. In addition, early pandemic surge plans included a focus on staffing needs in the hospital, creating COVID and non-COVID patient areas, securing appropriate personal protective equipment and developing and greatly expanding COVID-19 testing capacity.

FACING COVID HEAD ON

One of our main areas of focus when addressing COVID-19 was to slow the spread. We developed patient triage and management strategies to help keep our patients, team members and communities safe. These included:


- Call-Before-You-Go: Through an aggressive marketing campaign, we urged patients experiencing COVID-19-like symptoms to call our COVID-19 hotline (785-354-6000) before visiting our hospital or any of our clinics. This allowed us to better prepare for patients and to provide service in an environment that limited the chance of spreading the virus.
- **Drive Up Testing:** Located on Stormont Vail Health's main campus, Cotton O'Neil Drive Up Testing is a safe and convenient way for patients to receive a COVID-19 test without leaving their car. This service is by appointment only.
- Improved Health Precautions: By following additional precautions during COVID-19, we were able to help ensure the safety of everyone who turned to us in need of health care services. We implemented mandatory masks, screened everyone entering our facilities, closed waiting rooms and areas, and limited the number of visitors, as well as implementing an age restriction for visitors.
- Staff Support: Supporting our team members through the pandemic months has been a high priority. One effort we made was to offer no-cost childcare for school-aged children at the Kansas Children's Discovery Center. This service was offered for children attending schools with a hybrid or remote learning schedule.

OUTSTANDING CARE

Stormont Vail Health was honored to be named one of the Centers of Excellence by Kansas Perinatal Quality Collaborative (KPQC). The KPQC's Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) Initiative partners with birthing centers across Kansas to improve health outcomes for infants born at risk for NAS.



Cotton O'Neil Pediatrics was recently recognized by the Kansas Infant Death and SIDS Network (KIDS) as a Bronze Level. Through the Safe Sleep Star Program, Cotton O'Neil Pediatrics is committed to providing safe sleep education to the families of their patients.



Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas designated Stormont Vail Hospital's spine surgery program as a Blue Distinction® Center. Facilities designated as Blue Distinction Centers for Spine Surgery demonstrate expertise in cervical and lumbar fusion, cervical laminectomy and lumbar laminectomy/discectomy procedures, resulting in fewer patient complications and readmissions.



Stormont Vail Health and the Cotton O'Neil Heart Center received the 2020 Chest Pain – MI Registry Platinum Performance Achievement Award. The award recognizes hospitals participating in the registry who have demonstrated sustained, top-level performance in quality of care and adherence to guideline recommendations.

For the fifth year in a row, Stormont Vail Health was recognized by U.S. News & World Report as one of the best hospitals in the country. We ranked second in Kansas and achieved the highest rating possible in five procedures or conditions: abnormal aortic aneurysm repair, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, heart failure, hip replacement and knee replacement.

GOING FURTHER

As a Population Health Organization, Stormont Vail Health is committed to actions that improve the health of the communities we serve. This year, we gained more insights into how the social determinants of health impact the health outcomes of our patients and communities. We worked to collaborate and connect with community partners to address issues such as food insecurity, transportation and safe housing.

CARING FOR THE COMMUNITY

Stormont Vail partners with like-minded organizations to ensure our neighbors receive the help they need, not just in the form of health care. Stormont Vail's participation in the LINK program helps low-income households receive access to health care as well as education to develop health knowledge and training opportunities for future health care workers.

HELPING STUDENTS ADVANCE

We were proud to announce a scholarship program partnership to increase access to health care education and career fields. Working with the Stormont Vail Foundation, Washburn University and Washburn University Institute of Technology, we provided financial and scholarship support to local students who are fulfilling their education to enter a health care career. Areas included are nursing, surgical technology, health care technology, respiratory therapy, physical therapy and more.

SPARK

Stormont Vail was awarded funds from the Community Based Programs allocation of the Shawnee County CARES Act SPARK Funds. By partnering with the Topeka Public School's Center for Advanced Learning and Careers (TCALC) and Washburn Institute of Technology, we helped meet the growing health care workforce demands caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. The funds expanded Washburn Institute of Technology's Certified Nurse Aid (CNA) program through a new simulation lab at TCALC.

Nothing is more important to us than our patients' safety. We work every day to meet high-quality and safety standards so that you have exceptional care. We are guided in these efforts by our Patient Experience Department, the utilization of Press Ganey satisfaction surveys as well as insights from our Stormont Vail Patient and Family Partnership Council.

PATIENT EXPERIENCE

Stormont Vail Health owns patient safety. Our Gemba walks are an important tool that leadership uses to better understand safety and quality concerns across our system. Even through a COVID environment, we were able to perform 190 walks. We did this by limiting groups to 10 participant and offering virtual walks. Great things happen when a diverse group of people join together to discuss ways to improve both safety and quality in all departments.

STAFF EXPERIENCE

Stormont Vail strives to be an employer of choice. Our wellpower initiative encourages team members to be active and supports physical and mental health. This year, we proudly increased the

minimum wage for all team members to \$15 per hour. This new wellpower wage benefitted more than 800 Stormont Vail team members.

EXTRAORDINARY CARE AWARD

The Extraordinary Care Award is the highest recognition of Small Moments. It honors a team or individual who has made a significant impact toward Stormont Vail's mission and embodies the spirit of Stormont Vail values and the Small Moment Culture.

This year, we presented the Extraordinary Care Award to all of our team members for their hard work and perseverance throughout the year. We are incredibly proud of our team and the resilience they showed in the face of a global pandemic.

COVID-19 Timeline - June 16, 2020

EXPANSION

Even in the midst of a global pandemic, Stormont Vail Health realized the importance of growth. We set our eyes to the future, to a world not guided by COVID-19, and it was evident that the communities we serve will need more services and better access to health care.

MANHATTAN EXPANSION

Stormont Vail signed an agreement with Kansas State University to form an academic partnership in the College of Health and Human Sciences' Physician Assistant program. The program aims to provide local communities with health care providers who offer excellent medical care with uncompromising commitment and compassion.

Additionally, Stormont Vail announced plans to develop the Cotton O'Neil Manhattan Medical Campus. A 77,000-square-foot medical office building in the K-State Research Park will increase public access to medical professionals in the Manhattan region. The new medical campus will create a partnership between Kansas State University, the KSU Foundation, the City of Manhattan and the State of Kansas to attract industry and research to the northern edge of K-State's Manhattan campus.

SERVICE LINE DEVELOPMENT

Cotton O'Neil Asbury Drive Clinic: 2902 S.W. Asbury Drive, Topeka, KS


Opened in October, Cotton O'Neil Asbury Drive Clinic provides a new location for primary care, plastic surgery, dermatology, laboratory and imaging services.

Cotton O'Neil Foot and Ankle Clinic: 1315 S.W. 6th Ave A, Topeka, KS

Kansas Foot Care Associates, P.A. joined Cotton O'Neil as Cotton O'Neil Foot and Ankle Clinic. Matthew Galliano, D.P.M., and his six-clinic team became Stormont Vail employees as part of the merger.

Stormont Vail MRI Center: 731 S.W. Mulvane, Topeka, KS Construction started at the Stormont Vail MRI Center for expanded space for a 128-slice CT scanner to join the open MRI at the center. The center will be known as the Stormont Vail Imaging Center. The registration area was also redesigned.

In addition, a new CT scanner was installed in the hospital's Emergency Department. Imaging Services also installed X-ray and 3D mammography at the new Asbury Drive Clinic. In addition to that location, 3D mammography is available at the Jane C. Stormont Women's Health Center, Emporia and Manhattan clinics.

COVID-19 VACCINATION CLINIC

In an extraordinary combination of public and private enterprise, technology, science and industry

were harnessed to create safe and efficient vaccines. Stormont Vail is proud to be a leading distributor of the vaccines. We have developed a vaccination center at the Stormont Vail Events Center. In accordance to the KDHE guidelines and in cooperation with the Shawnee County Health Department, we began vaccinating Stormont Vail team members first, then increased the reach to more community groups as the vaccine became more readily available. At the time of printing, 25,207 had been inoculated at the COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic at the Stormont Vail Events Center.



ADVANCING PATIENT CARE

Stormont Vail is always looking to advance patient care. COVID-19 has opened our eyes to new ways of offering services to those who need us.

Mobile Clinic: The best way to offer care is to meet people where they are. The mobile clinic will feature two separate patient exam rooms and a small waiting area to provide primary care for 12-15 patients per day. We plan on an open date late summer/early fall.

Video Visits: To help keep the number of visitors to our hospital and clinics low during the pandemic, Stormont Vail implemented Video Visits. These virtual visits are ideal for follow-up appointments, questions regarding medication, pre- and post-surgical visits and hands-off consultations. These visits were proven very successful. We plan to continue using Video Visits in the future.




