A YEAR OF EXCELLENCE, INNOVATION, & IMPACT

We advanced toward our **fifth Magnet® designation**, a distinction held by fewer than **2% of hospitals nationwide**, according to the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) [data](#).

We also strengthened our nursing workforce and proudly secured our first **ANCC Transition Accreditation Program® (PTAP)** designation for our [Nurse Residency Program](#), demonstrating our commitment to supporting new graduates as they transition into practice.
